

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OVERPRINTED POSTAL STATIONERY - Further Remarks

(Communication from Jean-Marie FRENAY [av. Fond des Carpes 14, 1380 Lasne, Belgium] to R.H. Keach, 5th July 1999 which in turn was submitted to your Editor for publication as the observations are most interesting.. Translated by Michael Round)


Following the article which appeared in BCSC Bulletin No. 112 concerning overprinted postal stationery, I would like to record the following comments.

1. I own the following handstamped items:


- A. An E.P.17 demand card dated 30 NOVE 1897 with the following text : "Carte déposée sans formulaire réponse" ("Card presented without reply portion");




- B. An E.P.12 reply card dated 24 JUIL 1897 - thus much earlier than the recorded dates of usage 25 11 1897 to 20 1 1898 - and with the following [MS] annotation "Parvenu 'a Boma non accompagné de la carte demande" ("No accompanying demand card on arrival at Boma"). I wonder why such annotations were thought necessary on unaccompanied reply halves, since this was normal procedure and gave no opportunity for fraud.



2. CARTE POSTALE INCOMPLETE 61mm [handstamp]. Shown below is an E.P.16 reply card from Leopoldville 23 JUIL 1905, a date much earlier than the 1909 given in the article.




3. Framed BOMA CARTE INCOMPLETE on an E.P.12 demand card with full signature, from Leopoldville 2 FEVR 1898 with Boma transit mark.



NB. Postal stationery cards thus handstamped are usually found *without* signature [translator's italics] during the period 27 198 to 11 1198.

4. Framed BANANA CARTE INCOMPLETE with signature. Here is an E.P.17 reply card cancelled 29 DECE 1898, i.e. later than the recorded date 29 1898. [Illustrated on page 1 following original letter.]


Concerning the so-called Kambove overprint, [I record] an E.P.33 TY reply card cancelled Kambove 29 JUIL 19122, arriving from Lubudi. [Illustrated on page 2 following original letter.]

No. 1. This is probably one of the two cards from the Du Four collection, for it is known that Jacques Du Four, son of the General, sold most of his postal stationery, keeping only those with postal history interest.

THE INTERNMENT CAMPS IN THE BELGIAN CONGO (1940-1945)

It is no secret one that numerous points about the postal history of the Belgian Congo for the period 1940-45 remain to be clarified. The existence and the history of the internment camps are certainly one of these points about which one knows nothing much, that is to say almost nothing.

According to recovered documents, only the camps of N'Gule and of Elizabethville are known, both in Katanga. There were perhaps others in the North. (northern region) of the Congo or at Leopoldville. On this subject, the newspaper "Le Soir" of October 18, 1990 published a short excerpt from its edition of October 18, 1940 concerning the existence of an internment camp for Italians on a boat at Leopoldville, but it was a question of the "Soir volé" at the hands of the Germans. (see footnote 1)

With regard to the camps of Elizabethville and of N'Gule, the date go from March 30, 1942 (Fig. 2) to October 28, 1947 (Fig 9). According to the rare collected sources in the service of old colonialists, the Italians and the Germans residing in the Congo in 1940 were interned as civilians, including doctors, missionaries, and business representatives.

The copies of the following letters and documents which appear in the following pages give some references but also raise numerous questions.

FIFTY YEARS AGO

One could read in the "Le Soir volé" of October 18, 1940: In the Belgian Congo".
Some serious complaints have been received in Rome concerning the treatment of the Italians in the Belgian Congo where Italian Citizens have been interned on a boat under unhealthy conditions. The women must tolerate, from part of the population, the worst abuses

According to the "Popolo d'Italia" (People of Italy), this attitude of the Belgian authorities is inexcusable above all because there is no state of war between Belgium and Italy. But it is the British Consul in Leopoldville who gives his orders to the Belgian Governor-General

Let us recall that the printing office and the title of "Soir" were usurped by Nazi sympathizers throughout the war. (see footnote 2)

This letter to Florence, Italy emanates from the internment camp at Elizabethville on March 3, 1942 and received free franking (by airmail?) via Lisbon. The letter has been censored three times: in the Belgian Congo, in Great Britain, and in Italy. It is the only letter that I possess concerning the camp of Elisabethville.

This letter comes from the camp of N'Gule on May 5, 1942 to Switzerland. There is no censor's marking nor transit marking. The fee of eight francs does not correspond to the air mail rate of 1942 to Switzerland.

The internees could have, in conformity with international agreements and the Geneva Convention, used the messages of the Red Cross. The message above left Geneva December 5, 1943 to Ganyo Sake via Albertville and Bukama. It carries the censor's signature stamp of the

Belgian Congo. Having arrived at the destination, it is sent on to the camp of N'Gule. Let us note in the transit the unexpected use of the term "concentration" camp instead of internment camp. (I doubt very strongly that the existence of the German concentration camps had been known in the Belgian Congo in 1942).

The internee dispatched his reply on March 29, 1944 and an arrival stamp was affixed June 22, 1944.

One knows of no Red Cross message sent from one of the camps to foreign regions.

The same Italian internee wrote a memo to a missionary of Irumu in order to thank him for taking care of his son.

The last three letters are subsequent to the end of the war. The German civilians were apparently still internees in 1947 and the reason for it is unknown. The three letters bear the dates of January 7, 1947, March 17, 1947 and October 28, 1947. Two of the three letters have been censored by the British occupation authorities in Germany.

In spite of much research, no official information could be found concerning the camps. All the archives consulted have remained silent on the subject! If other collectors or elders of the Belgian Congo can give me information, it will be welcome, as well as copies of other similar covers.

NOTE 1: The expression "Soir volé" literally means "the stolen Soir" and apparently refers to the fact that, as indicated in the last sentence of the excerpt the printing facilities and the title of "Le Soir" were usurped by Nazi sympathizers throughout the war. Anything published or reported, by "Soir" during the war years might therefore be expected to be biased toward the German cause.

Note 2: As discussed above, the term "Le Soir Volé" refers to "Le Soir" usurped by Nazi sympathizers during the war.







Report of the President

"It is always difficult to be the President of an international club or organization and specifically a stamp collectors club with approximately a third of its membership in the U.S.A., a third in the U.K., a third in Belgium

and neighbouring European countries along with a few in Australia and South Africa.

Only occasional meetings can be organised like the one we had in Belgium in 1999 with 20 plus members attending the meeting at the Bruphila 99 stamp show.

The membership in Belgium is presently 42 members - rising from 35 in 1997. For the year 2000 we have 4 new members whilst 5 did not pay their subscription in 1999 and are considered as having resigned. If we want to increase our numbers and especially reach younger collectors we have to consider advertising in philatelic publications in the U.S.A., U.K. or Belgium. I am sure that we reach only a few of the collectors of Belgian Congo stamps or postal history.

The only way we have to communicate with our members is our Bulletin and we have, I think, to improve not only the content of our Bulletin but also the lay-out and presentation. The articles must cover as far as possible all collecting aspects including postal history. I am also sure that some articles could be published in French without the need of an English translation. Every member is able to understand and read some French - if necessary with the help of a dictionary. The Belgian members have been doing this for over 25 years. Finally, English and French are the two official languages of the Universal Postal Union and General Du Four's book (our bible) was never translated !!

With regard to our quarterly auctions, Mr.Philippe Lindekens took the job over at the end of 1999 and a new computer program was set up to run these auctions. I know Philippe is doing his best with administration help from Charles Stockmans. I wish to thank these two members for their efforts in helping our club. We have to ask our members to send more material for these auctions. Every collector has duplicates or other material for sale.

Improvements to our Bulletin and our quarterly auctions must be our principal priorities during the next 12 months to ensure we reach new members.

Finally I want to thank Edwin Lavitt for the Bulletin, Ray Keach and Stuart Smith for all their work on behalf of the Study Circle."

Discussion -

* It was agreed that articles written in French should be published in that language in future Bulletins.

* It was agreed at the Presidents suggestion that it was now time for a new list of members with addresses and telephone numbers (where known).

* It was agreed that the Secretary be asked to obtain details of members interests in the stamps and postal history of the Congo. In due course this should be published in a future Bulletin. Any member who did not wish to disclose any of these details could of course opt out.

* It was agreed that we should make greater efforts to recruit more younger members and that consideration be given to advertising in Philatelic Journals. By way of promotion we should approach the 'Belgian Study Circle' (and others) to allow us to insert details of the BCSC in their periodicals. Mr.Hoyte agreed to report to the Secretary the costs of a BCSC stall at MIDPEX for this purpose. The President would contact Mr.V.Schouberechts to see if he had any suggestions re advertising.

Post AGM comment from the Hon.Secretary re the suggested Publicity strategy.

"As Hon.Sec. I can confirm that the Circle is regularly approached and offered facilities of promoting itself by attendance at British exhibitions or taking advertising space in support of such exhibitions. In my short period

as Secretary I have adopted, upto now, the view that there is no likelihood of taking a stand as there is no realistic possibility of getting membership support to man it.

However it might be advantageous, and would not be unreasonable, to take advertising space in carefully selected publications. To enable us to do the latter it is fundamentally necessary, at either the AGM or an extraordinary General Meeting, to approve an annual budget for this expenditure and agree a format for our advertisement.

There are a few subscriptions for 2000 still outstanding.

Packet Secretary

"After what was generally agreed to be a successful Packet in 1998-99, I have to report that no Packet was circulated in this last year. Unfortunately no appeal for material was made and only one contribution was received. Another problem was that of insurance which has now become uneconomic for a small packet with a limited circuit.

One idea proposed is that each member on the circuit insures the packet when posting to the next on the list, subsequently claiming back that insurance cost from the Circle. Enquiries with the Post Office indicated that the only service available with insurance is 'Special Delivery'. The consequence would be that for a Packet weighing just under 1kg and in value less than £1000, the member pays £5.40 to post it to the next on the circuit and claims the difference between that and '1st Class Post' (£3.32), back from the Study Circle (i.e. £5.40 less £3.32 = £2.08). Alternatively and to save unnecessary paperwork that sum could be deducted from the total sum of purchases made.

It is hoped that the success of the last Packet will not be too distant in memory and that all those who contributed both as buyers and sellers will do so again. Hopefully others will be encouraged to join for the first time!"
