M.P. de Cook of the General Government Offices in Leopoldville has kindly supplied the Secretary with a complete list of post offices in the Belgian Congo and in Ruanda and this is appended to the Bulletin.

EXTRACTS FROM PERIODICALS

The Strand Stamp Journal - Volume VI, No. 10.

Fault Finding - Arthur Blair

Some of the re-entries and odd guide lines of the Mols issues are described. The article is of popular and not of specialist interest.

Le Philateliste Belge - Nos. 75, 76, 77 & 78

Les Timbres du Congo Belge (continued) - Dr. H. Avidon.

The series of articles continues with the story of the stamps overprinted "Colis Postaux". It appears that many stamps with this overprint were sold both unused and used as remainders by the Colonial Agency in Brussels. Mention is made of the unframed overprint on the 50 centimes of 1886.

Dr. Avidon gives details of the 1894-1900 issues, much of which has, of course, been published before. The river boat on the 10 francs value is usually regarded as the "Deliverance"; according to Dr. Avidon this is only the type of boat and its name was "Ville de Hasselt".

Although he lists the major shades Dr. Avidon points out that a considerable variation is often found in a single sheet thus making very difficult the study of the various printings. Unfortunately, he does not give the sequence of the various shades.

On the subject of the 10 centimes blue with inverted centre he gives the story of Kennedy's purchase.

(Dr. Avidon's series of articles is full of useful information and the Secretary hopes to prepare a translation for inclusion in the Study Circle Library).

La Revue Postale, No. 5

Les Conquetes Belges dams les l'Est Africain Allamand 1916-1917 - General Du Four.

This series of articles continues with descriptions of the war-time cancellations of Muanza, Kisumu, Malagarassi, Ussoke, the Kigoma-Tabora-Dar-as-salam Railway and the private cancellation of the Sultan Musainga.

La Revue Postale No. 6

Congo Belge-Du Neuf dans l'Emission de 1915.

The 10 centimes stamps of the 1915 issue from the booklet sheets of 10 can be distinguished from the Type II centred stamps in the sheets of 50 by the coloured circle around the lower left "10". In the sheets of 50 this circle is broken at the bottom; in the sheets of 10 the circle is complete. Complete sheets of 50 with the Type II centre are rare without the Malines surcharge.

Le Revue Postale Nos. 7 & 8

La Poste au Congo - General Jean Du Four

General Du Four writes of the posts and cancellations that existed before the issue of the first adhesives. He has divided these into three sections; firstly the Portuguese post at Banana, secondly that of the Association Internationale Du Congo with its stampless covers and cancellations of Issanghila and Manyanga, the Homeward and Inland labels of Hertwig with their various cancellations and various straight line cancellations including "Congo Africa" and "Congo River" and thirdly those used by the Independent State of the Congo before the issue of the adhesive stamps.

La Revue Postale No. 10

Congo Belge - 1915 - 15 Centimes - R H Keach

Two types of G in the word "BELGE" are found on the 15 centimes value of the 1915 issue. It is suggested that after the first frameplate was prepared the Transfer Roll for the frame was damaged.

LIBRARY

Mr. Joseph Wright has kindly given the Study Circle many articles from old periodicals and these can form the basis of our library. A list of the articles is appended; they are available on loan to all members of the Study Circle on application to the Secretary. Mr. Turner is kindly binding Andre de Cock's Treatise on the postmarks of the Congo and this will be available when completed. General Du Four's series of articles on the Mols Issues is in need of binding. Is any member of the Study Circle able and willing to undertake this job?

Will any members who have any other journals to spare kindly pass them to the Study Circle for inclusion in the library. Alternatively, if members have not duplicate copies, if they will let the Secretary have a list of what they hold and are prepared to lend to other members, then a list can be prepared of the whereabouts of all the literature available within the Study Circle.

NEW ISSUES

27 December, 1954

Two large bicoloured stamps of values 4,50 francs and 6,50 francs were issued to commemorate the 25th Anniversary of the Foundation of the Institut Royal Colonial Belge. These are printed on photogravure and are perforated 13. They are to be withdrawn on 31 December, 1955.

15 February, 1955

Four new values 1,50, 3, 4,50 and 6,50 francs were issued to celebrate the visit of King Baudouin to the Congo. Each value is duplicated, French and Flemish being given alternate precedence. The frames of the stamps are recess-printed in colour; the king's head is printed in photograture in black. A similar series in the same colours and designs was: issued for Ruanda Urundi. It is perhaps fortunate that "Ruanda Urundi" is spelt the same in French and in Flemish! The stamps are perforated 11½ and are, in the writer's opinion, very attractive. It is a great pity that the French/Flemish duplication has started again.

26 July, 1955

An attractive $6\frac{1}{2}$ franc value was issued to commemorate the 5th International African Tourist Congress. Once again, unfortunately, the stamp is duplicated, one with inscriptions in French and the second with inscriptions in Flemish. Both stamps are printed in the same sheet with alternate horizontal rows in French and Flemish, the bottom row in the sheet being in French. The stamps are recess-printed, perforated $11\frac{1}{2}$.

Will any member who has information on the printers and sizes of sheets of these stamps kindly inform the Secretary for inclusion in the next Bulletin.

The St. Francis Xavier stamps, issued on 19 December, 1952, were withdrawn on 1 April, 1955.

COMMEMORATIVE POSTMARK

On 12 February, 1925, Capitaine-Aviateur Edmond Thieffry left Brussels on the first flight to Leopoldville. He carried two letters which were stamped and cancelled at Leopoldville on 4 April, 1925.

On 23 February, 1935, a regular air service from Brussels to Leopoldville was started by the airmen Cocquyt, Schoonbroott and Maubertuis with the Sabena aeroplane "Edmond Thieffry". They arrived safely at Leopoldville on 29 February. Much mail was carried. On 4 March the aeroplane left Leopoldville, arriving at Brussels on 8 March, again carrying much mail.

This year's special cancellation has been used commemorating both flights and a reproduction is shown below.

If members have information on the period during which the cancellation was used, or if it was used in towns other than Leopoldville, perhaps they will kindly let the Secretary know so that he can include the information in the next issue of the Bulletin.

MATADI-LEOPOLDVILLE T.P.O.

Mr. Heim has a normal circular cancellation on a current stamp with the inscription "Matadi-Leopoldville" presumably used on the Bas-Congo Railway. Further information on this cancellation will be welcomed.

QUERIES FROM MR. HEIM

Mr. Heim has a copy of the Unilingual 5 centimes value (1909) with the Type 3 Local "Congo Belge" overprint. He believes it to be genuine. Have other members information on the existence of such stamps?

He has a cancellation with "Aketi" between concentric circles rather similar to one of the old telegraphic cancellations but not octagonal.

He has also seen some of the modern flower stamps with what looks like a blue grille covering most of the stamp. The spacing of the lines of the grille is 14 per centimetre each way, Have other members any information on these cancellations?

1909 - INVERTED TYPOGRAPH OVERPRINT

Early catalogues of the typographed "Congo Belge" overprints listed all values with overprint inverted. It was subsequently shown that on all values except the 50 centimes the overprint was invariably forged. Nevertheless Stanley Gibbons persisted in including 5 centimes and 10 centimes values with inverted overprint, priced now at 80/-d each.

The Belgian point of view now appears to be changing as the Balasse Magazine No. 101 adds these two values to its catalogue. Are we to understand that the Balasse Catalogue is now following Gibbons and will soon be listing the 5 centimes of 1909 and the 25 centimes of 1910 perforated $13\frac{1}{2}$?

It is to be hoped that the copies of the two stamps with typographed overprint, as seen by Balasse, are not like the amazingly good fakes owned by Mr. Wright, with overprints all of the large type even in blocks and strips.
